We are bound together in God's word through the book of Ruth to serve women of all ages at home and around the world.

On Monday, April 4th at 6:30 a group of nine gathered to enjoy an evening of celebration of friendship. We enjoyed a feast of goodies brought by Kristy in honor of her birthday, which is April 5th. We ate first and listened to tales of our travelers Mindy and Janelle, who had just returned from vacations.

The first reading was based on Proverbs 15...in a letter about a woman who was celebrating her 104th birthday. She credited laughter, the Lord, and the little things for keeping her going. (That sparked us to use this as our theme for next year's luncheon.) Kristy continued and explained each part: laughter— a merry heart makes a cheerful countenance, but by sorrow of the heart the spirit is broken. (Proverbs 15:15) True happiness begins deep inside and emerges on our faces. The Lord— the fear of the Lord is the instruction of wisdom, and before honor is humility. (v.33) When God is central in our hearts, He can teach us His way through every experience in life. The Little Things— better is a dinner of herbs where love is, than a fatted calf with hatred (v.7). Maintaining relationships and enjoying the basic things of life are more important than wealth and success. Happiness is not a destination but a day to day journey. The next reading was about the aging process. Psalm 71. We worry about the numbers in our ages like a man who had recently turned 60. He was concerned about the first digit being a 6, and all that implied about growing old. But he said that the trauma of turning another decade shouldn't be that but turn us to the lessons, joys, and blessings we have found throughout those years.

As the years add up, God's faithfulness keeps multiplying.

Our next topic was what to do over the summer. We decided to have monthly gatherings, but off campus. We discussed some options and are going to plan for some fun events in June, July and August.

Power point replacing bulletins comments requested by office or bring to Pastor Matt. Otherwise the comments have all been positive for this method. Spires available on Kiosk has gone well, with over 97 families picking up their Spires. Checking with Roots about recycling of eternal candles. Charlie Brown purchases these and many of the other things we use for worship. Minnesota Teen Challenge Choir/ Orphan's Choir from Uganda both have requested to come to sing at our church this year. We have committed to Spoke Folk, so will consider the others in 2012 or 2013. We looked over the LLLC booklet and made corrections for the office. Nursery: We want to know which committee along with worship and music this belongs to. We need to revise the Nursery policies and will talk with Mary Johnson. I would like some other committee (Education / Youth) to talk with me and discuss the policies with Mary. Sound system—all Council Members who have first service responsibilities need to be able to work the sound board. The acolytes could do this job possibly. I don't believe that the acolytes need to be seated up at the bench in the front of the church, they should be in the congregation and face the power point to follow along. We need to talk with Kris Bjorke about the change in what the acolytes could be doing for worship. We're still working on getting a 2nd service person to be a part of the Worship and Music committee.

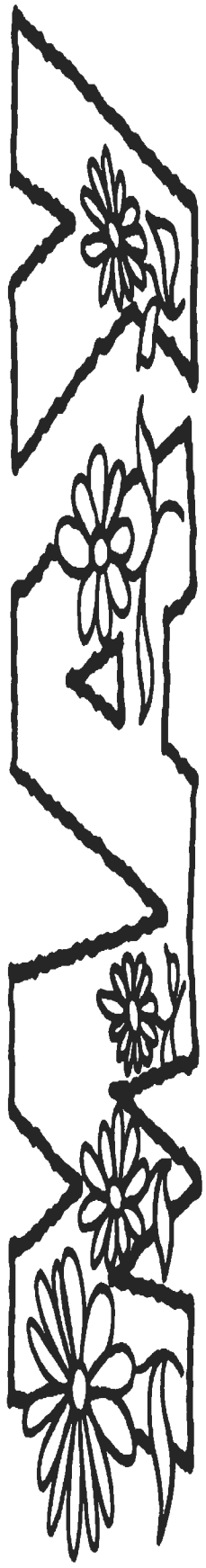
