***"We are bound together in God's word through the book of Ruth to serve women of all ages at home and around the world."***

On Monday evening of this snowy January 3<sup>rd</sup>, we met in the Cornerstone. We wasted no time in getting the table cleaned off so we could lay out the materials to put together our Newborn Kits. We had only enough supplies to make up 7 kits. We noted that we are in dire need of gently used towels, washcloths, and some ivory soap (bath size). So if you are cleaning out closets or received a new set of towels for a gift...we could use the old gently used towels and washcloths. Thank You!

We ate our snack as June lead us in a devotion read from an Email message sent out to her by Pastor Tim Best entitled: **Much Needed Good News (Matthew 9 37-38)** "Ten Best Nuggets of Good News You could Ever Read in These Hard Times." 1. Jesus still feels the same about you today as He always has! He loves you! 2. Jesus only wants good for you! 3. Jesus' love reaching out to you does not change! 4. Jesus has a gift for you and like all gifts it is paid for at His expense. 5. God has no desire or interest in condemning anyone for their sins including you! 6. God wants to put your sins out of His and your mind forever! 7. The God of the universe wants to become your intimate friend who speaks to you and helps you navigate through this troubled world. 8. God wants to bless you and make your life rich in blessing. 9. God wants you to be assured that though the world is filled with hurt and pain, that is not His will and if you give yourself over to Him, He desires to protect you in the midst of it. 10. God does not want your world filled with hurt and pain. He wants to save you from it. It starts by believing in His Son , Jesus Christ and asking Him to forgive your sins and be your Savior.

Then June shared a story about a church goer who wrote a letter to the editor of a newspaper and complained that it made no sense to go to church for 30 years which meant he had heard 3000 sermons and didn't remember a single one of them. So Why go to church? I am wasting my time and the pastors are wasting theirs. An answer came back to him in the response from another reader in saying: "I've been married for 30 years. In that time my wife has cooked some 32,000 meals, but for the life of me I can not recall the entire menu for a single one of those meals...But I do know that...**they nourished me and gave me the strength I needed to do my work. Likewise, if I had not gone to church for nourishment, I would be spiritually dead today.**

Connie showed us the materials she had found for our placemats that she will make for us to use at the luncheon. She also had some other material that matched it, and together with the placemats will be made into a quilt to be auctioned off at the festival this year. Spring Luncheon set for March 19<sup>th</sup>, will have a menu with four types of salads and some bread choices along with a dessert. We will be charging the same price of \$10.00/person, our speaker has not confirmed yet, and many others things will come about in the next two months to ready us for this Luncheon.

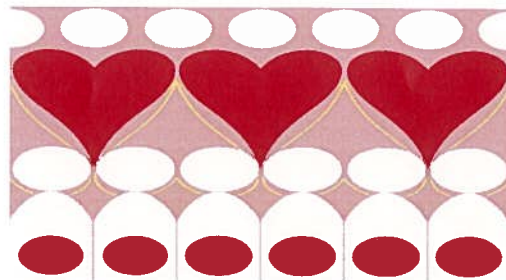
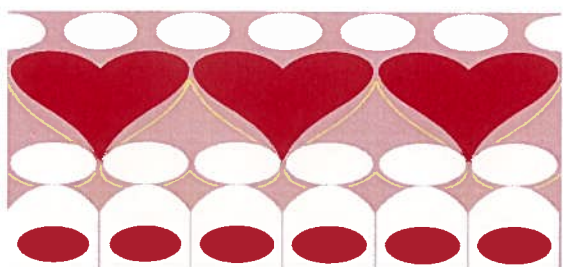
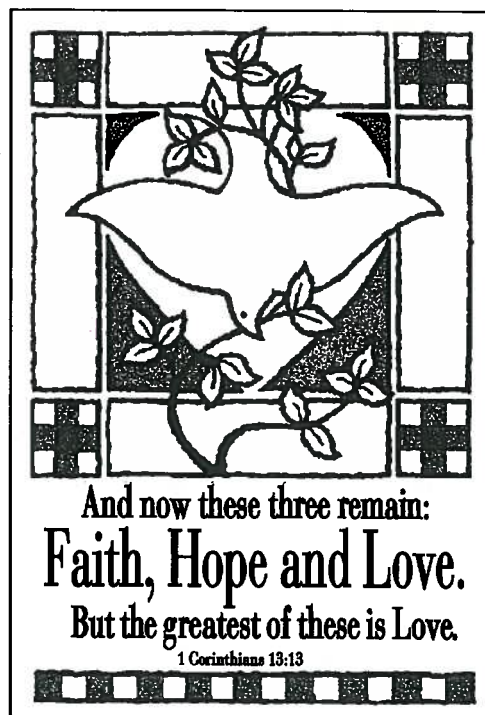

Romantic love surely does have the ability to command our attention.

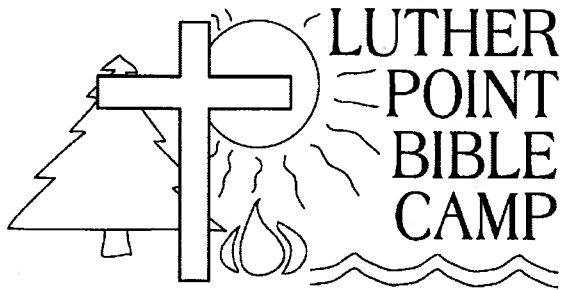
Romantic love is great, but there are other kinds of love. There is brotherly love, the kind of love we have for our neighbors and friends. There is Familial love, the love of a mother for a child. Love to us as Christians is important because it is the best way that we have for determining our progress as disciples. As we grow in our love of God and as we learn to feel God's infinite love for us, this love will spill out into our other relationships. How much we love those around us is our best measure of how we follow Jesus.

To put it another way, we can't very well call ourselves disciples of Jesus, if we don't have any or don't show any love for those around us. Paul reminds us in his first letter to Corinth, ***"And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love."*** (1 Cor. 13:13) In the evening, before I go to sleep, I make it a practice to reflect on the day. A very helpful lens to look at my day is to ask myself, "How have I loved today? Do I seek to love others as Jesus has loved me?" We should read the Bible every day, but our discipleship is not measured in pages read. We should pray throughout our day, but our discipleship is not measured in minutes with our eyes closed. (Most especially if you pray while you are driving!)

When anyone asks us why we are members of Long Lake Lutheran, we should be able to say that we belong because we are disciples of Jesus, that following Jesus is our life. 1 Corinthians 14:1-2 teaches us, ***"Go after a life of love as if your life depended on it—because it does. Give yourselves to the gifts God gives you. Most of all, try to proclaim his truth."*** (From the Message paraphrase) I invite you to reflect this evening on life and love and to never forget that the infinite God love you infinitely.

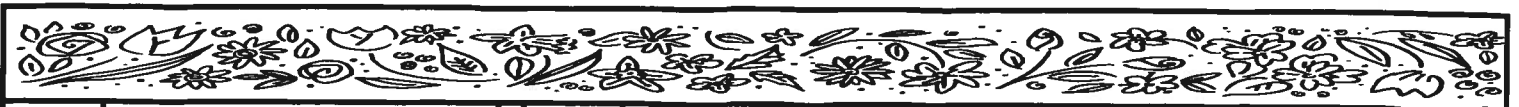


