I want to thank everyone who had a part in putting together soup suppers, those who cooked, served and cleaned up, all who helped with worship, our faithful Altar Guild, our volunteer readers, ushers, greeters, kitchen helpers, IT guy Kent and Slide Technician Dylan. It takes a village, and we are so fortunate to have the loving and willing volunteers that serve out God in so many ways.

Now, we start thinking about our summer worship. I was contemplating a sermon series on digging deeper into Old Testament Bible stories that you learned in Sunday School. With that in mind, the Camp Onomia Board of Directors voted to move forward with VanMan and a capital campaign for a new Friendship Hall for dining and activities. It was exciting to be in on that process to see how our discussions will go.

Council Meeting Minutes

2024 Council Retreat - Camp Onomia

Theme "Knowing Your Why"

Date: March 1-2, 2024

Attendance: Pastor Sue, Mike Schlegel, Margaret Bauer, Denise Sunderland, Dave Baker, Joanne Eittriem, Michelle Yurich, Monica Petersen, Josh Budnick, Morgan Engren, Kari Osmek

The meeting was called to order at 7:15 PM. Pastor Sue led an opening prayer.

Joanne provided devotions centered around "What Makes Us Strong".

Pastor Sue presented notebooks to the new council members and provided new documents for the upcoming year for all members.

Council duties were discussed for both Worship services and events held at the church.

Safety was discussed regarding medical/AED training, weather emergencies, and safety threats. Margaret will be contacting someone who may be able to come in and lead a safety day training for the council and any members interested in attending.

Old business was discussed.

The Mission Statement was reviewed and determined that everything we do needs to advance our mission, otherwise it will not be funded.

Josh and Margaret provided an update from the call committee regarding our forthcoming plans of calling an Associate Pastor vs switching gears to look for a Youth Director. The call committee has put together questions they will be posing to John Hulden to determine are best next steps. Matt Lundeen is also going to be reaching out to Pastor Matt and Eric to see if they have any connections that we may be missing. The call committee will then review and come back to council with their recommendation.

The Technology Report was reviewed. Kent is creating a manual that will provide direction for when he is not available. Feedback has been great with our partnership with Corporate Technologies. Kent has requested of Finance that we upgrade our wireless access points in both buildings (Estimate of \$1,500-\$2,000) and to upgrade the computer in the Cornerstone used for Sunday School and Confirmation (Estimate of \$680-\$700). Finance has approved the computer to be replaced first with the wireless access points upgraded in a future month.

Building Task Force is on scheduled to have their first listening session with Vanman in April. Our payment to them is not due until this first meeting is held.

Constitution is in review by the Finance team who are currently reviewing the Scholarship fund and the Cemetery Board.

New Business was discussed.

The Preschool Task Force is working together to get a licensed contractor to come through the Cornerstone to give us a professional estimate of the cost of work that would need to be done.

The Finance Report was given. The General fund ended the month of January with \$17k, which was lower than December as expenses were high in January. A lot of those expenses were known with Kari's December payment being in January as well as property had the pews cleaned, carpet cleaned, and Mossman came out. The February report will also be lower due to paying Bell Construction \$70k. We will be creating a task force related to getting our paper records at the church cleaned up. Margaret and the finance report will take the lead on appointing the task force. The process of green slips was discussed.

Council structure was discussed and ideas on how we could possibly enhance the effectiveness of it. More discussion will be needed and the council was asked to ruminate on this.

Master calendar was reviewed with the only change this month being that Easter breakfast may move to Palm Sunday. Michelle will be the documenter for any changes/additions/subtractions needed throughout the year.

Pastor Sue presented an Event Planning Worksheet. This will be used for teams to document how their event fits our mission, the planning process, the budget and volunteers needed, as well as review of the success of the event through different lenses. These will be filed with each event to be used as a resource in following years.

Pastor Sue presented a Church Facility User Agreement. The form was accepted by the council with one change to the damage deposit. The form will be revised and brought back to the council for a vote for approval.

Kari presented to the group on strategic planning for our Youth & Family. "Organizational Systems Theory" was presented and how it relates to Family Systems. Information was given on different demographics and generations, Faith Assets, and how the church can help reach the youth and families of today.

Council/Strategic Planning was then discussed. Goals, Objectives, and Action Plans and how they all work together to produce outcomes. Each member was challenged to go back to their team to define what their team's goals, objectives, and action plans for this year will be.

The council's 1 year, 3 year, and 5 year plan was reviewed from last year. The updated plan looks like this:

1 Year – Improve safety and security with a task force. Research possibility of cloud based technology. Landscaping. Team strategic planning. Hire a full time youth director. Explore option to improve the compensation of our employees. Review HR policies and procedures. Review layout of council.

3 Year – Look at how to expand Congregational Life events.

5 Year – Implement building task force plan.

April team reports are to include each team's goals and objectives.

Pastor Sue then shared on the Ten Commandments, Covenant of Leadership, and Running an Effective Meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:00 PM and concluded with the Lord's Prayer.
