

Advent originated in the 4th century as a period of preparation for baptism at Epiphany, with an early mention in Spain in 380 AD. It later evolved into a liturgical season of anticipation for both Christ's first coming (birth) and his second coming, with the modern four-week period before Christmas solidifying in the 9th century. Key traditions like the Advent wreath likely have roots in 16th-century Germany and earlier pagan traditions, while modern Advent calendars became popularized in the 19th century.

Early origins

- The term "Advent" comes from the Latin adventus, meaning "coming".
- The earliest references to a season of preparation similar to Advent date to the 4th and 5th centuries in Spain and Gaul.
- At this time, Advent was a 40-day penitential season of fasting, prayer, and reflection in preparation for the baptism of new Christians on the feast of Epiphany in January.

It was a time of preparing for the second coming of Christ and was not initially connected to Christmas, which was celebrated on a different date.

Development of the modern Advent

- In the 6th century, Roman Christians began to tie Advent to the coming of Christ at Christmas.
- The Roman Catholic Church fixed Advent as the four-week period leading up to Christmas in the 9th century.
- Historically, Advent had a dual focus: the first half of the season looked forward to Christ's second coming, and the second half focused on his birth.

This is still reflected in some modern liturgical themes.

The practice of observing Advent spread throughout the Christian church by the 6th century.




WELCOME TO THE PRAYGROUND!
