GET EXCITED!!

I am writing this month's message from the beautiful Canadian shores of Rainy Lake. This is my sec-



ond trip "up north" this summer. I have enjoyed this lake for nearly 70 years and am still so enamored with God's amazing creation. Turtles, bald eagles, great blue herons, ruffed grouse, ancient rocks, and an interesting array of pines, birches, cedars, blueberry bushes, wildflowers, and lots and lots of grasshoppers and mosquitoes. I worship God, the creator, forgiving Him for creating mosquitoes and pine beetles. I love my calling to public ministry at Long Lake Lutheran, and I appreciate the salary you provide. I am ever grateful for your support in giving me Sabbath time to rest and rejuvenate. I do other things up here besides fish! I have time to study my Bible, read for pleasure, and ponder what God has in store for us.

I am excited for our fall ministries, even though I don't want to wish away summer. I've been looking at our new Thursday morning Bible study that will begin after Rally Sunday. I am excited that our visioning team will continue to think Big and plan for the future of Long Lake ministries.

⁹Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; ¹⁰love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. ¹¹Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. ¹²Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. ¹³Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers.

¹⁴Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. ¹⁵Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. ¹⁶Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. ¹⁷Do not repay anyone evil for evil,

but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. ¹⁸If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. ¹⁹Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." ²⁰No, "if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads." ²¹Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good."




