From the desk of Pastor Sue:



February Newsletter from the desk of Pastor Sue "Fish Food for Thought"

I read a book on my vacation, one of many, actually. It was called, "Why Men Hate going to Church," by David Murrow. He wrote, "new research reveals the importance of men to congregational vitality and growth. Almost without exception, growing churches draw healthy numbers of men, while declining congregations lack male presence and participation...Religion is not going to disappear. Men will always seek God.

In the early 1800's, two missionaries sailed from England for the jungles of Africa. Both men were powerful preachers. The first missionary built an English-style church, preached in English, and imposed an English-style dress code on his African congregation. The second missionary built a church that resembled a local gathering house. He preached in the native language and allowed people to dress as they pleased. Which man do you think was more successful?

Jesus called us to be fishers of men. We need men to stay in the boat, and not jump back into the sea. Any engineer knows that your system is perfectly designed to give you the results you're getting. In other words, if you always do what you always did, you'll always get what you always got. "IYADWYADYAGWYAG!"

The system of the church is perfectly designed to get the results that we have always gotten. The system of the church is perfectly designed to reach women. In the book, "Men are from Mars, Women are from Venus," Dr. John Gray outlines two sets of values. The values in set A are: competence, power, efficiency, achievement, skills, proving oneself, results, accomplishment, objects, goal orientation, success, competition and self-sufficiency. The values in set B are: love, communication, beauty, relationships, support, helping, nurturing, feelings, sharing, relating, community, loving cooperation, and personal expression. Which of these two values do you think Jesus embraced? Set B, right? Which of these two values do you think the church normally embraces? Set B, right? Dr. Gray exposed a startling truth. Most people feel like Christ exhibited the values of set B, or the values that seem to come naturally to a woman. To be like Christ, means to be loving, nur-

turing, always caring, always compassionate, always gentle. Jesus does not judge people; he hugs them.

Men don't hate God or Christ or the Bible or Christianity, but they are bored with a system that is perfectly designed to reach someone else. Albert Einstein once said, "Everybody is a genius. But if you judge a fish by its ability to climb a tree, it will live its whole life believing it is stupid."

Christianity was founded on the principals of one man and twelve followers who were men. The church grew by mostly male ministers and male dominance. 95% of senior pastors in America are men. In the Catholic church, every priest, bishop, cardinal, and pope are male. Some church denominations' boards are comprised entirely of men and women are not even allowed to vote. At the risk of gross generalization, it would appear that the church is male dominated. But, look in the pews, look in the committees, look in the bible studies, prayer groups, lunch groups, service groups and who do you see? Women. More women than men. The only exception to this is the property team, which is comprised mostly of men. Why is that? Because, the property team, fixes things, they problem solve; they keep the property mowed, plowed and shoveled.

We want this to be a church for all people, men, women, children, single, married, people with kids, people without kids, seniors, teens, everyone. Think of us all as fish in God's aquarium. We have already been caught. As leaders of this church, as progressive thinkers, movers and shakers, do we want to only feed the fish in the aquarium, or do we need to keep fishing like Jesus commanded? And, how are we going to do that without making some changes? "IYADWYADYAGWYAG!"

Tell me what you think! Can we fish for all people? Men, women, children, differently abled, young, old. One size does not fit all! Feed the fish; fish for people!






