From the desk of Pastor Sue

Psalm 148

Let all creation praise and worship the Lord!

¹ Praise the LORD!

Praise the LORD from the heavens;
praise him in the heights!

² Praise him, all his angels;
praise him, all his host!

³ Praise him, sun and moon;
praise him, all you shining stars!

⁴ Praise him, you highest heavens,
and you waters above the heavens!

⁵ Let them praise the name of the LORD,
for he commanded and they were created.

⁶ He established them forever and ever;
he fixed their bounds, which cannot be passed.

Hopefully, you noticed that all of the readings, songs, temple talks, and sermons in June focused on God's amazing creation. It was wonderful to hear from Karen Baker about organic farming, Marcy Stoekel and the community garden, April Tighe on pollinators, and the Hepp family on the Keep Nature Wild Program. Thank you to all those willing to speak to us on their care for creation.

Many of the Psalms are worship and praise songs that were sung by memory as Jews went to the temple. Many of our worship hymns have their roots in the Psalms. One of my favorites is "On Eagle's Wings," ELW 787, which comes from Psalm 91. And from Psalm 90, perhaps the oldest known Psalm, comes "Oh God, Our Help in Ages Past."

This great collection of songs and prayers found in the Psalms expresses the heart and soul of humanity. The whole range of human experiences and emotions are expressed in them. There are no clichés, platitudes or trite sayings. David and other writers pour out their true feelings reflecting their relationship with God. They confess their sins, express their doubts and fears, cry out in lament, and ask God for help. Many of them express great praise for all God, our creator has done for us.

As a Christian, worship matters. Or, at least, it should. Worship in our church setting includes music, scripture, prayer, message and offering. It includes the experience of participation in the Lord's Supper, or Holy Communion. The weekly gathering of God's people around word and sacrament is our

offering back to God of our time, talents and treasures on the Lord's day, the day of resurrection.

Lutherans have always been a liturgical church. That is to say, we have a well established pattern for our worship: gathering, word, meal, and sending. Our two sacraments are Holy Communion and Baptism, where we are transformed as people of God who are sent into the world for the sake of the world. In Lutheran worship, we are not spectators, but active participants in the worship of God.

God does not take a vacation from us; there is never, ever, a time when you can't reach God. Yet, our attendance at worship drops off considerably in the summer and our offerings take a nose-dive. I pray that you all get time off to enjoy your family and outdoor recreation in the summer; that is critical to your mental health. But, I also pray that you do not let your worship life and spiritual growth stop during the summer. We still hold worship services at 9:00 on Sunday mornings and 6:00 on Wednesday evenings. God's ministry and work is just as important in June, July, and August as it is during the school year.

I know that sitting in a pew in church doesn't make you a Christian any more than sitting in your garage makes you a car, but your God, deserves to see you once in a while, deserves your praise and thanksgiving. Your church needs you as much in the summer as it does the rest of the year. Don't you just crave those words of forgiveness, the taste of wine and bread to remember our Savior, singing songs of praise, hearing scripture read out loud, and actively praying for other people? You've heard this: "A week without God makes one weak."

I invite you to make an effort to put God front and center in your life year 'round. Come to church when you can. Make your offering a regular part of your weekly or monthly budgeting. Give God the greatest gift that God craves: YOU!

Council Minutes 06/10/2021

Staff Reports

Pastor Sue and Shawna submitted reports to the team. Pastor Sue shared that she had attended a required theology education class in Minneapolis on Monday. This was great fellowship with other new pastors. Team discussed if -more structure was needed for funerals. Carol Perrin has agreed to be the funeral coordinator. Financially this is supported by the family of the deceased. Pastor Sue and staff will review the funeral/wedding policy and compare it to other local churches for updating if needed. This will be completed by August 1st and shared with council next month. Pastor Sue submitted a draft of a “memorial fund policy”. Council team will review and provide feedback.

Team Reports

Thanks to the teams who were able to send reports prior to meeting.

Worship/Music- Hymnals are in the pewsJ! Donations are still coming in from the congregation. Team is considering ordering 40 more. Worship times are being discussed for the fall. Team will send out a poll/vote to get thoughts from the congregation.

Property- All buildings were pressured washedJ. It was suggested this to be done every 5 years. The “to do” list will be revisited and prioritized with immediate things such as the water leak in Jen’s office. Dan will also get a bid for the cleaning of the pews in the sanctuary.

Education- We have 12 kids signed up for VBS that begins June 14th. Adult education will be back in the fall.

Stewardship- We are receiving great comments and feedback regarding “Creation” month.

Congregation Life-Food Truck fellowship will be August 19 with 4 confirmed vendors at this time.

Youth- We will be recognizing our 2021 seniors this Sunday. Our team traveling to Alaska will be meeting this Sunday also.

Missions- There will be a team meeting this Sunday. Discussion of gathering a team to support the Shalom shop in Cambridge, more to come. Congregation enjoys when Jim Werronen is in service.

Finance- We are at 38.5% of our budgeted expenses. Our giving is average and financially we are in good health. We did see an increase with expenses. Our new contract with Church Mutual for insurance coverage began in June. Reviewing of financial reports showed that a line item for continuing education money is located incorrectly and needs to be moved/corrected. Explanation of the “general grounds maintenance” line item in May on page 4 is for our grave site property. The FICA concern is still being reviewed by our accountant for Pastor Sue. Council stated this is great feedback and would like a written report submitted prior to meeting.

Support Shawna/Pastor Sue

Pastor Sue shared that showing up and helping with service is great and very helpful. She encouraged us to build up our teams by engaging other members. Please continue praying for Shawna and her family. Sam was hit with a ball in the face and needed surgery. Congregation members are signing up to volunteer for the needs of a worship service (ushers, greeters, readers, and etc.) but not “worship teams”. The process of passing a “clipboard” for volunteering opportunities to members has been productive in the past. Executive team met and will begin and create a more formal meeting to support Shawna and Pastor Sue. It was suggested to have a meeting after VBS with members who use the Cornerstone to discuss storage space and usage.

Recommendations from the Taskforce

Task Force team supports the MDH requirement of continuing with a Stay Safe Plan through the earlier of June 30, 2021 or until 70% of Minnesotans aged 16+ receive at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine. The required components are already in the original plan. Team also supports self-serving of donuts/cookies with the continued usage of hand hygiene.

Housekeeping (procedural items)

Technology Team- a proposal via email was submitted to the team to change our phone/internet service from CenturyLink to Verizon to increase our overall quality and consistency of speed for services. This would increase our cost monthly by approximately \$100 and an additional \$50 if we need to keep CenturyLink service for the fire system needs.

Discussion- Team discussed the need to know if this is a 2 year contract. It was stated this would be a month to month contract. Also, would this change support internet coverage in the Cornerstone and if we need to keep CenturyLink for our fire system. Council would like to have this information before approving. Kara will send this back to the technology team to get more information.

Motion not approved

Reminder- Council team to check your boxes for green slips to support the process of check signing/payments

Visioning- Pastor Sue has reached out to 3 of the 4 architect firms. She is researching and gathering information. She would like for us to make a decision next month.

New Business

Communication Improvement- how can we provide better communication regarding if we are having communion, day events/meetings, and etc. We will use a white board in the narthex, share info in the e-news and the calendar in the Spire. A calendar will also be posted with volunteers and council reps in the office for review.

Movement of Council meetings-It was identified during an executive meeting that it would be helpful to move the council meeting to the 3rd Thursday to provide the Finance team more time to review reports and provide written feedback to Council. This is not necessary after discussion with team. The Finance team will be meeting on the 3rd Thursday of the month going forward and Dennis will email this to Jen to share with congregation.

July! Happy Independence Day!

I cannot believe how fast the summer is flying by! I hope you and your plants are surviving this heat!

I also cannot tell you how much my family and I love the Creation Care temple talks. It is so great to hear from people in our community and congregation about the passions they have for preserving our Earth. Personally, it makes me reflect on the responsibility God gave us. From Genesis 1: 26-28:

“Then God said, “Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth.” So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. And God blessed them. And God said to them, “Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth.”

The word “dominion” sticks out. It means to control and have complete power over something. As the phrase from *Spiderman* goes “with great power comes great responsibility”. We have a responsibility to take care of everything He has created. With this in mind, a few years ago, my family and I decided to pick five single use plastic items (plastic shopping bags, single use coffee cups, straws, plastic water bottles, and plastic baggies we used for snacks) to discontinue using and try to pick up trash at least once a week throughout the Lenten season. It was a big adjustment at first but it was very enlightening. Since then, picking up trash has been something that we have continued; we rarely use plastic baggies, and are more aware of our single use plastic bags/straws. The single use coffee cups are a bit trickier. What is even more important, however, is the conversations we get to have because of this small effort.

In October, we joined an organization called “Keep Nature Wild”. It is a community of people from around the United States that dedicate one day a month to picking up trash either locally or at organized events. Those that are part of it are called “Wild Keepers” and are tasked with keeping our nature (wherever that may be) wild so that even the smallest of

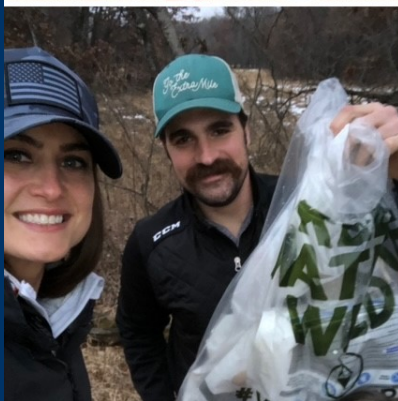
creatures can live naturally. While picking up trash we have found and seen so many different things. One significant moment was when we found a discarded birds nest on the ground in which the birds had woven plastic bag pieces into it. It was a sad but oddly uplifting moment as I watched Liv, Grady and Mac identify that the bird had used trash because a human had left it on the ground. It solidified a need for us to be there.

There have been many moments like this and I thank God each time that He has allowed me to witness the passion He put in each of my kids. He has given them the chance to see the cause and effect of the power humans have over all His creations.

A 'thanks' goes out to the Stewardship team for putting emphasis on using our power for good.

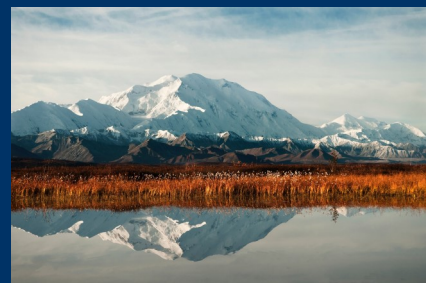
We've been planning this trip for 2 years. There have been ups and downs, changes in destinations, COVID, and the anticipation has been building and building.

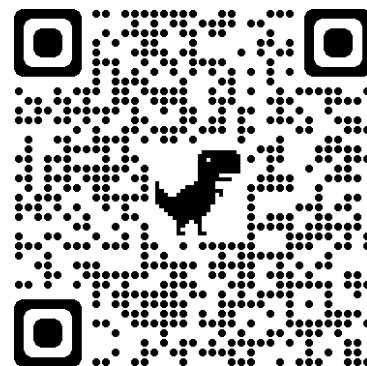

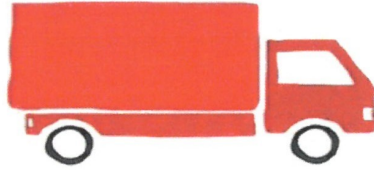
I want to thank my team for helping put this together, they did a good job.

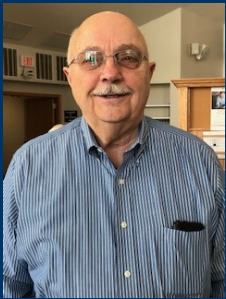

A.A. Step By Step

Step Seven

Humbly asked God to remove our shortcomings

Step Seven is a Step we apply daily in our lives. As with Step Six the Seventh Step is never completed. The removal of some of our character defects and the reduction of others is a lifetime process. Some of them we are just too stubborn to even look at. It's far easier to see someone else's defects than to look at our own.

In the Sixth and Seventh Steps of the program, we become willing to let go of our defects of character-issues, behaviors, old feelings, unresolved grief, and beliefs that are blocking us from the joy that is ours. Then we ask God to take them from us.

Isn't that simple? We don't have to contort ourselves to make ourselves change, we don't have to do it alone. All we have to do is strive for an attitude of willingness and humility. All we have to do is ask our Higher Power for what we want and need, and then trust God to do that which we cannot do and do not have to do for ourselves.

We do not have to watch with bated breath for how and when we shall change. This is not a self-help program. In this miraculous and effective program that has brought about recovery and change for millions, we become changed by working the

Steps. The manner and the timing of the removal of our character defects are up to God. Being humble is being open to the will of God however that will is being expressed. By asking humbly to have God remove our defects we are saying "Thy will, not mine, be done".
