From the desk of Pastor Sue:



Did you hear about the Lutheran church that was having their annual meeting? There was a big discussion going on about buying a new chandelier for the sanctuary. Pastor Svenson was all for buying it, while Pastor Oleson was totally against it. Back and forth they went. Finally, Pastor Svenson said to Pastor Oleson, "can you give me four good reasons why we shouldn't buy this chandelier?" Pastor Oleson said, "ya sure, I can. Number vun is dat it costs too much. Number two is dat none of us can even spell chandelier. Reason number tree is that none of us can even play a chandelier, and most importantly, number four is dat before we buy one of dose tings ve ought to get some more light in here!"

I'm so happy we don't have these kinds of disagreements! We are blessed with a congregation that wants great things to happen here for God's glory. Looking forward to a long future for Long Lake Lutheran Church seems to be the attitude among us. We have a visioning team that envisions a building project within the next five years. We have a youth and education team that is excited to build a playground for our current youth, for the youth in the community, and to welcome young families into our midst. We have a call committee acting on the authority of the congregation to call an associate minister with a focus on youth and family. The Worship and Music Team has been working to bring a contemporary worship service to add to our traditional service this fall. Our Congregational Life Team is busy planning our Community Food Truck Fellowship Event following Vacation Bible School on Thursday, August 3rd and is hosting a church potluck picnic on Saturday, July 8th. We have an interim youth director who is working with LifeRice to pack food in November. Our Friends of Ruth are bringing in the Looney Lutherans for a Saturday evening of hilarity (Oct. 7th).

We have invited Pastor Lee Schuemann to present about his mission work (July 16th) in Ukraine with a possibility for us to partner with Oxlip and his organization.

And that's not everything! In other words, we are busy working for the kingdom of God out here in the middle of the corn field! How exciting! New people are drawn to churches that are doing things, not churches that just gather like a social club to entertain themselves. We are doing wonderful things here at Long Lake Lutheran and I am so grateful to be a part of this mission to bring the Gospel to the world.

Paul wrote to the church in Philippi, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the thing that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you." (Philippians 4: 4-9)

We are doing God's work here. I love that we are looking forward to the next generations. Things we are doing now will keep Long Lake Lutheran Church viable into the future to broaden the reach of the message of the love of God for His people. That's what we are here for.



The decision was made to purchase our equipment through Midwest Playscapes and we will be placing our order in the coming days. Based on the delivery timing, we will be planning the install of the equipment the week of October 16th or later.


