We were also at the cabin the most in June which she loved because she was surrounded by family, friends, and fun. My mom was all about relationships.



Joanne verified the Virtual Votes April Council Meeting Minutes.

John motioned to accept the meeting agenda with additions, Julie seconded.

Report Questions

Playground update: Monica said lead times for the equipment are very long (6-7 months) with a cost of \$49,000-50,000.

Beginning this fall the Sunday morning schedule will be 8:30am Worship, 9:30 Education Hour, 10:30 Contemporary Worship. Unsure of Wednesdays.

<u>Staffing</u>

Technology: One person, 7-10 hours per week. Kent will write a job description. **Reminder** that Brenda Polipnick is available to work on projects that Council Members may have for her.

Associate Minister Call: Bruce Yurich reports the Ministry Site Profile is complete which he reviewed with the Council. Bishop Ann will be here for the Congregational Meeting on June 11.

Old Business

Constitution Review: Brenda has completed the work to include what the Synod wants included in the document. Council will meet to review later this summer/fall.

Minnco: We are just waiting for the new credit cards to arrive.

Life Rice: Kari is interested in heading this up, possibly on November 12?

Website: Brenda has been looking at it and making recommendations to Tony.

Insurance Claim: work is starting June 5 and will take 2 weeks.

Bell Wire: Kent is working on this.

Walk-In Fire Safe: Brenda will research.

Appraisal (Preserving History): Wayne Olson is working on this for the Triptych in Fellowship Hall.

May Finance Report

The team reviewed reports and the church's financial position with the General Fund ending the month of April with a balance of \$64,797.08. This is considerably higher due to several large contributions between March and April. The team is reviewing historical summer givings and options for any investing opportunities.

Recommendation from the finance team to move the \$200 from the Festival/Auction Fund to Congregational Life for the Food Truck Fellowship.

Mike motioned for these dollars to be moved, Monica seconded, discussion – none, motion carried.

Recommendation from Ronda to move the \$239.96 from the Cornerstone Upgrade Fund to the Capital Fund.

Mike motioned for these dollars to be moved, Monica seconded, discussion – none, motion carried.

What to do with the gifted statue of Jesus: tabled until gift policy has been reviewed. New Year Check List: Finance, John, Julie and Ronda

Use of van by St Philip's Lutheran Church (July 23-28)**:** Does not interfere with Summer Stretch or Youth trip to Duluth.

Provide Child Care for the June 11 Congregational Meeting: still looking.

Child Care availability in Isanti County: Discussion ensued about the need for it and how a new building at Long Lake Lutheran could help fill that gap.
