From the desk of Pastor Sue...

#1. The Hymn, "This is My Father's World," was written in 1901 by Maltbie D. Babcock. It is his tribute to nature and his frequent walks in the country. Each time he went out for a walk by his home on Lake Ontario, he said, "I am going to see my Father's world." I am reading a book, "Our Father's World, mobilizing the church to care for creation," by Edward R. Brown. In the foreword, Dr. Ed Johnson writes that politicians, scientists, and governments will not provide the solution to Climate Change, but that the church is the last, best hope to respond to this defining issue of the twenty-first century. It may be God's work, but God will use us to make the necessary changes to save our planet.

When you read Genesis, and I hope you do, you will find the words of God calling all that God made, "good!" We, the human species, have used and abused this planet we call home and it has to stop. We need to repent, turn around, renew our vows to protect what God has created. All that we do must bring glory to the Creator, advances to the cause of Christ, transformation of God's people and the land that sustains us. With care of creation in mind, we are forming a Green Initiative Team that will evaluate the "greenness" of our property and make recommendations where we can do a better job of protecting the earth.

We live among God's beautiful and diverse creations of birds, wildlife, fishes, and insects. We are blessed with abundant, clean water in Minnesota. We have rich, fertile land which provides food. Our air is pretty clean as there are no strong polluters in our area. But we rely too heavily on disposable products, and we are missing the opportunities to recycle glass, plastic bottles and cans. We must be more vigilant about our waste.

The team invites you to become a part of this initiative. Our first meeting will be June 3<sup>rd</sup> at 5:00 pm. We would appreciate your participation on the team.

#2. The safety and security of our staff and our properties is on my mind lately. The world around us has changed so much and no place is truly safe anymore. I invited Deputy Sherriff Lisa Loverling to walk around our building and evaluate our issues. She had many recommendations, so a Safety and Security Task Force is being formed to consider our needs, our gaps in safety and security, and where more education is needed. They will report to the Property Team and propose a prioritized list of improvements. The task force invites you to become a part of this initiative. Our first meeting will be June 3<sup>rd</sup> at 6:00 pm. We would appreciate your participation on this task force.

#3. A huge thank you to the people who drove down to my graduation ceremony on May 19<sup>th</sup> at Central Lutheran Church. It was an amazing service, and I am truly grateful to have been a part of it. Thank you for the gifts, well wishes, prayers, cards, words of encouragement and support. I am so humbled by your show of support and am so appreciative of this congregation.

#4. Even though I have graduated from seminary, I will not be ordained until I am called to a church. I will be asking for your patience in the changes being made to our Holy Communion schedule. I cannot preside over the sacraments of Holy Communion and Baptism, so I will invite a few other available pastors for help on certain Sundays. Our communion schedule may vary due to the availability of pastors.

#5. Please don't forget your church over the summer. Worship continues at 6:00 pm on Wednesdays and 8:00 and 9:30 am on Sundays. If you do happen to go to another church, I appreciate seeing their bulletins and newsletters. Bring back new ideas!

#6. You are invited to join me on Tuesday mornings beginning June 4th at 8:00 am for an outdoor, nature, walking bible study. We will meet at LLLC at 7:45 and carpool to various locations for 1 hour of hearing the Word of God in a natural setting. In case of rain, we will meet in the sanctuary at LLLC.

I pray that you will be able to enjoy God's creation this summer. Relax and read! Read God's book. Read another good book. Read the book of nature. Listen eagerly to God's voice. Listen to nature. Listen to one another.



I'm sitting in my office listening to music for our upcoming Vacation Bible School. The words for the theme song are really striking a chord with me.

This last Sunday we celebrated our graduates, and I thought these words were perfect for them – entering into a new phase of their lives, with a lot of unknowns but a lot of excitement too! I can't wait to see where God is leading them. These words are also perfect for many of us. I turn on the news these days and I often feel like life is just getting too crazy and overwhelming. Here at Long Lake Lutheran I'm sure many of us feel like our heads our spinning – I've been here since August and in that time we have said goodbye to a youth director, two Pastors, one support staff, a custodian and a parish nurse. Wow! That is a lot of change. We have had funerals of loved ones and walked through challenging health diagnoses and life changes, I'm sure there have been days when it all has seemed like just too much – yet in the midst of chaos there has been some pretty amazing things happening too.

Since August, we have baptized 11 children and welcomed them into God's family, and our family here at Long Lake. In October, we celebrated with 8 young people and their families as they reaffirmed their baptism and celebrated their confirmation. We presented Bibles to our third graders, had 15 students celebrate their first communion and presented quilts to our graduates. In addition, we supported six different mission projects, sent a large group to pack meals for Feed My Starving Children and shared the message of Christ's birth through the live Nativity to over 300 people in our community. We've celebrated countless meals together, both in the fellowship hall and around the altar. God's word has been preached and shared. Gifts of money, music, hospitality and more have been shared time and time again. This church is strong, and I have no doubt that God will lead this church in amazing directions and to continue to do good things. As the song says – "can't hardly wait to see what's next!"



## A.A. Step By Step

Step Six Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character

This step asks us whether or not we are entirely willing to have God remove all these defects of our character. In other words, are we willing to behave differently from the way we have in the past? Are we willing to change ourselves and be changed? If we are not willing, we are faced again with self-will. We are once again insisting on our own way even if it is the destructive way.

Step Six is about willingness. We cannot remove our character defects without the help of our Higher Power. Some days we are more willing than others. We must constantly pray for willingness. The impossibility of achieving this Step perfectly, however, does not mean we should not try to do it as completely as we can.

This Step is the most difficult of all the Steps to take from a technical standpoint because of the words "entirely ready." Almost no one is "entirely ready" to have his or her defects of character removed, or if you wish, our sins.

There is always some point we just can't give up. What we must recognize now is that we exult in some of our defects. We really love them. We just look at them differently and then they seem OK.

Many wonder how Step Six can be worked. To do so would be perfection. Only Step One, where we made 100% admission of powerless over alcohol can be practiced with absolute perfection. The remaining eleven are goals to estimate our progress. Difficult but not impossible. Beginning-not the end.
