February 2017 Council Minutes

February's council meeting was called to order at 6:30 on the 9th.

Pastor Matt lead devotions from the 16th chapter of Matthew.

Those present were Jim W., Claudia, Marsha, Stephanie, Dave, Pastor Matt, Eric, Jennifer M., Margaret, Matt L., and Jennifer S.

Pastors report: The purpose of the year will be discipleship. We will continue to upgrade the A/V systems. We will hopefully be getting a new student pastor this fall. Pastor Matt has five interviews scheduled with seminary students. Pastor Matt will be gone March 20-25.

Eric: We will be handing out Bibles to the 3rd graders at the end of February. First communion instruction is coming up soon. VBS is getting organized as well.

Worship and Music: Lent is less than a month away. The theme for Lent this year will be "The 6 Marks of the Church", from Mary Hinkle's book, "Signs of Belongings." The pulpit swap will happen again as it did last year. There will be a massed choir performing at St Andrews on Good Friday.

Stewardship: Time and Talents tracking sheets are out for the different groups at church and it should make keeping track of the volunteer hours much easier.

Missions: Joseph's Granary is being organized and dating foods to limit expiration. The Refuge is taking foods that are nearing their expiration dates, so there is very little waste. The mission of the month for March will be area food shelves. Habitat for Humanity dates are getting finalized. Jim is considering taking a mission trip to Thailand at the end of July.

Education: We welcomed Jennifer Manion as our new council representative and as the chairperson for education. She said that the Education Team is always looking for new members.

Finance: The budget has been broken down into each individual team's budget and all teams are encouraged to stick to their budgets and try to save money.

Congregational Life: A lot of planning is being put into the benefit for Alvin and Deb Arens. Volunteers and items for the silent auction are needed. Please let us know if you can help in any way. More details will be coming soon.

Property: The Fix it Day will be on February 25, from 9- about noon. We will be replacing lights in the Cornerstone, hanging bulletin boards in the fellowship hall, and various other tasks.

Old business: The master calendar was reviewed. The employee handbook is almost completely updated. There is a small group of people that are interested in being part of the discipleship planning. Talks about the number of recipients and the dollar amount of the Founders Fund Scholarship took place.

New business: Pastor Mary will begin her call interviews soon. We could lose her as early as May 21. Eric's hours will be reduced for his chaplaincy beginning in June. Pastor Matt will work the Summer Stretch. Dave will help with visitations of around 10 per month this summer too. Hiring a retired pastor on a part time basis for the summer to help with visitations was discussed as well.

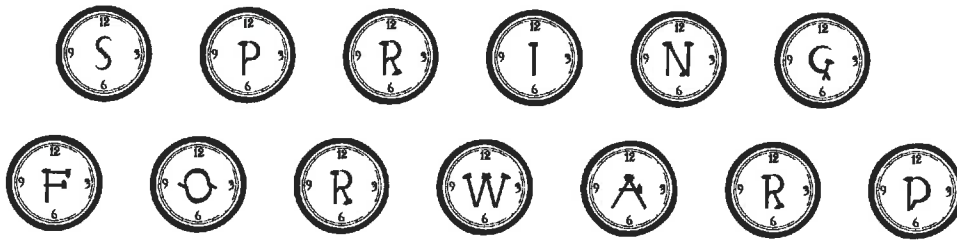
We adjourned the meeting at 8:30 p.m. and closed with the Lord's Prayer.

I'd like to share a story about two individuals in our congregation who need our support.

Many of us go on vacation in hopes of relaxation and enjoying the time off. Alvin and Deb Arens traveled west on their Harley Davidson motorcycle last June. The vacation came to an abrupt stop. They were in an accident with another vehicle while on that motorcycle.

Alvin had multiple broken bones. One leg had compound fractures and surgery was performed to put a steel rod in the leg. After the surgery, a staph infection set in and he spent another 10 days in the hospital. He had broken ribs, a bruised heart, a punctured lung, memory loss and hearing loss in his right ear.

Deb broke her pelvis in three places. She too had broken ribs, six of them. Within her face, she broke her nose, the sinus area and cheek bones. Her foot needed reconstruction and plates and rods were put in.

They were moved from the hospital into a short-term care facility from July 4th to Labor Day.

Both have traumatic brain injuries that were obtained due to the impact of the collision. Damage to their eyes, cataracts, double vision and when the eyes are extremely tired they droop. The doctors have put prisms in their glasses to help with the double vision. Deb's doctor told her that continuing to change the eyeglass prescription is useless due to her eyes are changing so much during this time. She has dropped back on her hours at work because of this.

Today they are both mobile and the healing process continues with the help of physical therapy.

The medical bills and therapy costs unfortunately are not all covered by their insurance. A benefit is now underway to help with some of these bills.

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I personally am very thankful that our members of Long Lake Lutheran Church are always known to jump in and help with congregants and/or tasks that need to be done.

I am reaching out to each one of you to prayerfully consider where you could play a part in helping Alvin and Deb.

Can you put them on your prayer list?

How about putting the date of March 19th on your calendar from Noon - 3 and stop by the Isanti Community Center (208 1/2 - 1st Ave NW Isanti) for the spaghetti and meatball lunch benefit?

Do you have friends or neighbors you could invite?

Maybe you want to buy a \$10 lunch ticket, or a monetary donation made out to Long Lake Lutheran Church. In the memo write: Alvin and Deb Arens Benefit.

Maybe you feel you could donate a good or service to put in the silent auction or you know someone that would like to?

How about volunteering to bus tables, help set up or tear down.?

These are some of the idea's that are out there.

Assuming we have all known some type of financial burden in our lives, my prayer and hope is to support Alvin and Deb in their healing process in any form you and I feel so moved.

THE LENTEN JOURNEY

Being "born" Lutheran, that is baptized as an infant and raised in the Lutheran faith, certainly has its advantages. Pew time is one of them.

My mom had some very serious surgery when I was in 4th grade. During that time my Dad was the head of the Sunday school; so after I attended class the first service I was able to go to "big church". I loved to sit right in front of the pulpit so I could see the pastor clearly speaking without any of those pesky adult heads in the way. I loved the service though I couldn't read music, nor could I read well enough to follow along; so I challenged myself to memorize the songs of the liturgy. To this day, my then victory, is still really my favorite -"Create In Me A Clean Heart O God." I was very contented to have the pastor smile at me or wink occasionally. Apparently, as all good Lutherans do, I felt compelled to take my assigned pew once chosen. At first it was wonderful! However, some of those sermons were difficult to understand and the yawns arrived. Oops. I had no hope but to pay attention as best as I could! Over the years and in spite of occasional yawns, my pew time has taught me much.

In addition to learning from the sermons and liturgy there is also the church decor. The season I liked the least was Lent. Not only did everything look somber, it was somber. As I became a confirmand I was touched even more deeply by the Bible stories and sermons. One Maundy Thursday I felt so saddened and heavy hearted I vowed not to attend the service anymore. It was too sad, and too shameful. So I often skipped and went to Good Friday instead. The stories of Jesus' disciples' shortcomings were worrisome and downright frightening to me. If they, who were His best, who had walked and talked with Him, could not last an hour in prayer for Him - what was I to do? If they, who had shared journeys and meals with Him, listened to His stories and loved Him, could deny Him so

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easily - what chance did I have? How could I ever be good enough to be acceptable? Painful questions that pique at the human heart I think. Working through my own very long, list of shortcomings and feelings the answer is simple: I can't. The best part of the story comes next: He Can, He Did, and He Does! He didn't forsake His disciples. He loved them and us, so much, in spite of all our shortcomings! He suffered all on our behalf and saved us from ourselves and death. Perhaps what we can do in return is to love Him, honor and praise Him, and give Him our best.

My prayer for each of us is that we go forward this Lenten journey with joy and thankfulness, doing our very best for Him.

Change...comes a little bit at a time.

STEP THREE

Make a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.

Step Three has been summarized as: I can't, God can, I think I'll let Him. Our spiritual awakening is partly a process of becoming real. We are shedding the games that maintained our old style of life-macho or hero or poor me. In it's place we are developing a real relationship with ourselves. Sometimes change comes in a moment of sudden awareness but more often it comes a little bit at a time. As we work the Steps, as we are true to our inner voice, as we keep returning to conscious contact with our Higher Power, as we get closer to our friends, we become more real to ourselves.

In the past many of us closed the door on the reality of our abuse to ourselves or others. We gave explanations but our words more often hid the truth than revealed it. Many came into the program priding themselves on their honesty, but now are aware of how dishonest they were with themselves.

Honesty is a pillar of spiritual awakening. There is no growth without it. It begins with ourselves. We do not define the truth, we accept it. We surrender to it. The truth may not feel good; it can even be painful. This is the reward of having our integrity and the peace of self-acceptance.

The Serenity Prayer really ties into the Third Step. In that we ask for God's help to "accept the things we cannot change, courage to change the things we can, and wisdom to know the difference. Thy will, not my will, be done." The decision to turn our will and lives over to the care of God is made almost as often as the decision *not* to do it. The Serenity Prayer helps keep us centered when things don't go our way. Lives not only include our life but also our life as a spouse, employer, friend....all our lives.

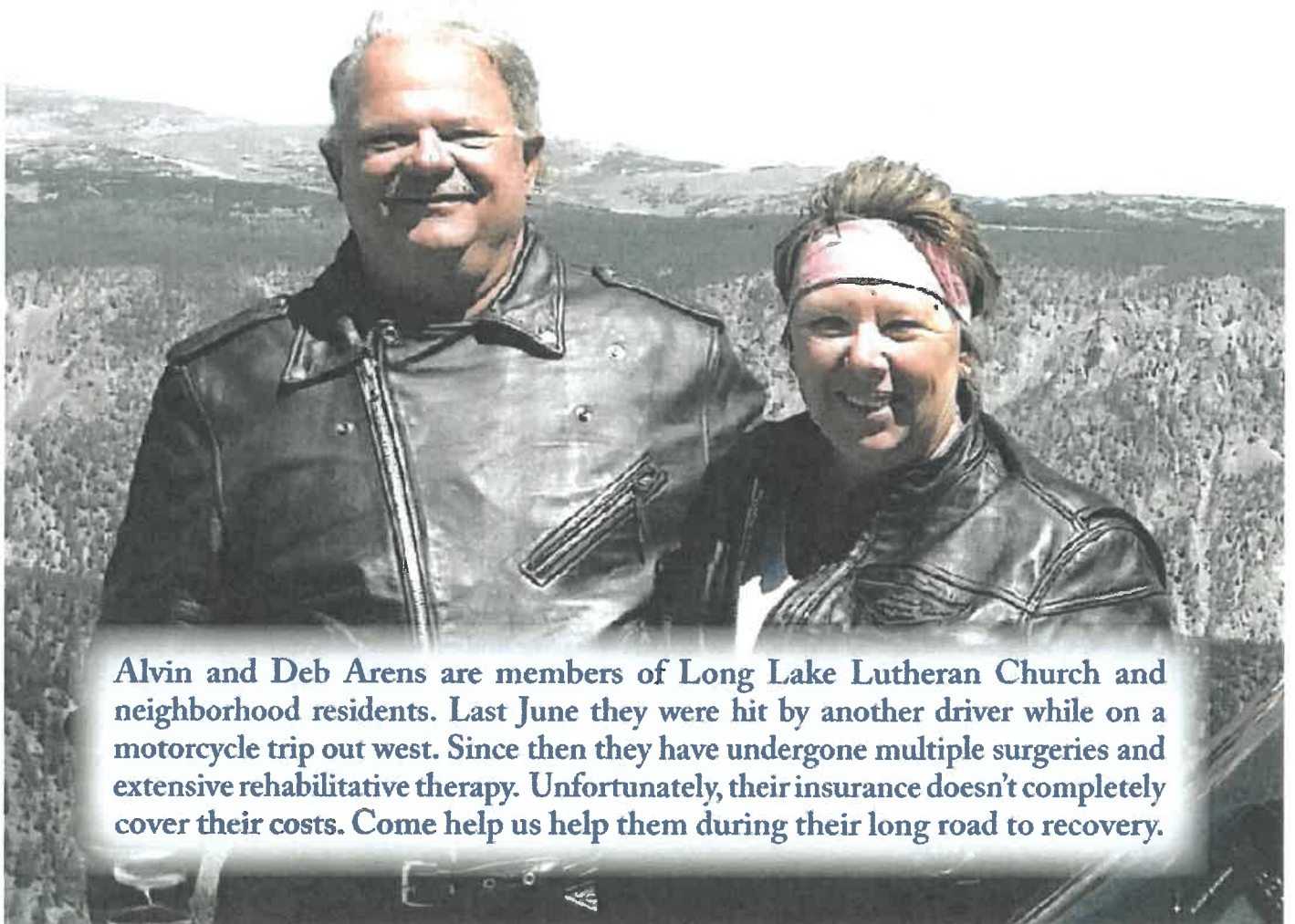
