From the desk of Pastor Sue:



GOD IS LOVE!!

This month, I invite you to read the 3 letters of John. They are located at the back of the New Testament just before Jude and Revelation. They were sent as pastoral letters to several Gentile congregations, but also seem to apply to all believers everywhere for all time. They are believed to have been written by John, the beloved disciple of Jesus, to dispel doubts, and to give confidence and assurance in God, and in their faith. The word "love" appears more than 40 times in these letters. Because God loves us, he calls us his children and makes us like Christ.

In our dark world, God is light (1.1-2.29); in our cold world, God is love (2.29-4.21); and in our dying world, God is life (5.1-21). False teachings had begun to disrupt the community of new believers. John's writings invited these believers into a deeper relationship with God through the good news of Jesus. It's about relationship with God first and foremost, but then it's about fellowship with other believers. The Greek word for fellowship, koinonia, means "to share, partake, partner." We are partners in the light with Christ. If we do not cultivate fellowship among us, we are walking away from the light into dark territory where Satan can have a field day with us, causing us to sin.

1 John 1: 5-10 (NIV)



⁵ This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. ⁶ If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth. ⁷ But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.

⁸ If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. ⁹ If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. ¹⁰ If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us.

¹¹ For this is the message you heard from the beginning: We should love one another.

It is hard to believe that it is November already! Before we know it, we will be eating pie, and celebrating together at our Pie Social.

Thanksgiving has always been one of my very favorite holidays. Perhaps it is because it hasn't been overly commercialized, and it isn't attached to a church holiday (which for me, often means work). This means that Thanksgiving for me simply is about family, good food, and time spent together.

When my kids were tiny, we started a tradition of special tablecloths that we put out each year on Thanksgiving (these were plain off white tablecloths I bought, nothing special) that we have every person who celebrates with us sign and date and write what they are most thankful for that year. If we travel to someone else's house for the holiday, we bring our tablecloth, spread it out on the floor, and ask everyone to sign it, to remember who we shared the holiday with, and continue the tradition.

This year, my mom and brother will be coming up from New Mexico to celebrate Thanksgiving with us, and it is the first time we will celebrate that holiday since my dad has passed away earlier this year. I was thinking about my tablecloth yesterday, and found myself get really emotional, and very thankful that I have all those years of my dad's writing on that tablecloth. On Thanksgiving Night, our entire family, will go to the Vikings Game in his memory. My dad was a die-hard fan, and always wanted to go, and never made it to a home game. When the new stadium was built, we bought a brick in his honor. We will all go and see his brick, and watch the game together, and toast his memory (and hope he is pulling some strings up there to help them this season!).

I am glad that we have found a way to be thankful, and celebrate, in the midst of what could be a sad day. The practice of gratitude, and finding something to be thankful for, doesn't minimize pain (we know, we will still be sad) but reminds us of the reasons that we still have to be thankful. Gratitude allows us to be thankful for the memories that we have, for the loving family and support system that remains, and for a faith that sustains us when times are difficult. We are grateful for a faith that reminds us that this life isn't the end of the story, and for that, we can also celebrate.

I hope that this month you will find your own reason to be grateful.

For this reason, because I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers. **Ephesians 1:15-16**

LifeRice Meal Packing Event

Last Spring, the Youth and Education team were brainstorming ideas about events. We talked about a meal packing event we went to with a few members of our church in a previous year, and talked about how fun that would be to do here, but didn't really know how realistic it would be. We thought it would be a really fun thing to do, possibly in connection with Rally Sunday. After doing a little research, we discovered LifeRice, an organization based in Cambridge, MN that does mobile food packing events and began talking to them about bringing a mobile pack to Long Lake Lutheran.

We brought the idea to the church council. No one really knew for sure if we would be able to pull off what we needed to do to make it happen, but we all agreed that we wanted to try! The Stewardship, Congregational Life, Mission and Youth and Education teams decided to work together to make this event happen. We set a goal of raising \$5,000 to purchase the ingredients, and getting 100 volunteers to pack food on the UN World Food Day, which was October 15th, 2022.

To begin the process, we had a few people who said they would support the event with a donation, Sunday School decided to give their offering for several months and the mission team committed one quarter of their offerings to the cause. We knew we were well on our way to raising our funds! Kara Hepp and the youth and education team helped to organize a fun run to help raise money for the event. This event, raised \$750 to go towards the meal packing event, and was a lot of fun for all the people who participated (most of them families). We had a course at church complete with color run stations, goofy tasks and the weather cooperated beautifully. Finally we took a special offering and we ended up taking in \$6,100 – surpassing our goal!

The next questions was, would we be able to get 100 volunteers on a Sunday afternoon – during a Vikings game? No problem! We had 116 people sign up to help pack food from 11-1 p.m. and other community members purchased food and came into pack from 1-3 p.m. All in all about 200 people packed around 58,000 meals!

This was an event that was intergenerational with 4 year old children serving along side 80 year old members of our congregation and community and it was so much fun! Families were able to serve together. It is our hope that this can be an annual event.

Thank you for supporting this event with your time and talents and financial gifts. Together we can make a difference in our community and the world!

It looked like a mountain of congealing glue,


Yet oddly transparent and discolored in hue.
