# Pastor Sue Olson

This is truly an exciting time for us here at Long Lake Lutheran and I am so grateful to be a part of it. **Thank You Lord!!** A new season of Fall programming has begun with Sunday School, Children's Church, Confirmation, Youth Group, Mission Quilting, Congregational Bonfire, Spaghetti Dinner and Trunk n Treat coming up in October. Look around you and see that God is truly present in the ministries of this church and beyond. I am convinced that God has big plans for us! **Thank You Lord!!** 

Pastor Bob Rusert begins serving as our Interim Lead Pastor as we discern our ministry and staffing needs for the future. **Thank You Lord!!** We need to look beyond today, at least 5 years into the future to dream and be inspired by the opportunities God is putting before us. A transition team will be formed to begin the work of studying who we are as a church in rural Isanti County, and to whom we are called to minister and serve. Then a call committee will be formed to match the needs of the congregation with the right people. Trust God and trust the process. We want to make sure that everyone's voice is heard and respected.

I invite you to pray mightily for God's will to be done. As we work together to serve God, you will be asked to prayerfully consider your current giving of your time, talent and treasures. In 2017, with a membership of 872 (231 giving units or households), we supported a budget of \$404,378. That is just under \$33.66 per week per giving unit. Unfortunately, we know that approximately 40% of our giving units contribute less than \$5.00 per week. That means that some families carry a heavier load. Of course, we understand we all have differing budgets;

some people are in a stronger position to give more. We are thankful for each and every aift, from the smallest to the largest. Your gifts to Long Lake Lutheran Church support a wide variety of ministries along with a beautiful building, staff, and utilities. Think of what we could do with an increased income. If 231 giving units each gave \$5 more a week, we could raise our budget by \$60,000. Think of how we could grow our ministry.

Ask yourself if God is calling you to grow your giving and make a Statement of Commitment to Long Lake Lutheran Church on Commitment Sunday. We give thanks to God for all He has done for us; we give back to God our first



fruits in response to the abundant love and mercy shown to us. Thank you for all you do for our church. Thank you Lord!!

## Youth

One fall, when my children were younger, we were driving home from church when I had an interesting conversation with my son. We were talking about the worship service and things we had heard when all of the sudden he asked "Mom, why don't you and dad ever give any money to the church in the offering?". I have to admit, I was a little surprised by the question. For many years, and for many reasons my husband and I have chosen to give electronically to the church, and have had our offering taken directly out of our checking account each month. This seemed to be a good model of giving for us as it ensured that we were giving of our "first fruits" and not just from whatever was left over each month. It also helped keep us accountable to our pledge and whatever we had promised to give the

church each month. However, I had realized, that although he and I had discussed this plan and this decision, never once had we told our kids about it and now, as we were driving home I was stunned to realize that my son had thought for years that we had just chosen not to give and he couldn't figure out why. I spent the next few minutes explaining to him that we did give, and that our offering came right out of our bank account each month and went directly to the church. We also spent a significant amount of time talking about the "why", and why we thought it was important to give. We then had a discussion that when the pledge cards came to out home later that month, that we would all sit down as a family and fill it out together, so that we could all know what our pledge would be and what kind of sacrifices our family would make in order to make the pledge we felt was most appropriate. We decided that we would talk about what things we would intentionally be choosing not to do, so that we could make the intentional choice to support the church with our gifts in the way that we do. Giving back to the church with our gifts of time, talents and money is our way of saying "Thank you, God" for all the gifts that God has first given us.

This conversation, this off the hand comment by my son, got me thinking about a lot of the values and choices that we make as a family that I sometimes don't fully explain to my children. I take it for granted that they understand why we make the decisions we do. We bring our children to church, and yet don't always share with them why we feel it is important. We want them to hear the stories in the Bible, yet sometimes have neglected to share with them our own faith stories. We want them to feel like it is important to give back to others by sharing their gifts of time and talents, but we don't always model that, or tell them why we think it is important when we drag them along to do it. The conversation on the ride home that day, reminded me how much we are missing when we miss out on these conversations with those we love.

Have a conversation with someone you love today about your faith story. What gifts has God given you that you would like to say thank you for? How can you share the gifts you have been given?

If sufficient money is not raised to complete the project ALL funds will be used for other Youth needs. Timing for construction has NOT been set at this time.

## **NEW Business**

Pastor Bob Rusert letter of Agreement as our Interim Pastor has been signed and is in the hands of the Synod. Start date is Tuesday, October 2. Marsha made a motion to approve the Letter of Agreement, Matt 2<sup>nd</sup>. Motion Passed. Official Title is Interim Lead Pastor. Pastor Bob will be here every Wednesday, Sunday and either Tuesday or Thursday depending on activities at the church. Reviewed the 2018 Housing Allowance resolution for Pastor Bob. Marsha made a motion to accept, Jennifer 2<sup>nd</sup>. Motion passed.

Stephen Ministry – Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ (Galatians 6:2, NRSV).

Stephen Ministry is the one-to-one lay caring ministry that takes place in congregations. Stephen Ministry congregations equip and empower lay caregivers—called Stephen Ministers—to provide high-quality, confidential, Christ-centered care to people who are hurting. Building one on one relationships, addressing basic life and spiritual needs of members in the congregation/community. Lay associates providing high quality Christ centered care. Looking at bringing this Ministry to Long Lake in the future.

Reviewed costs to implement a Stephen's Ministry - \$4 -5,000.

Staffing: Council will be posting for Business Admin support. 20 hours/week. Responsibilities include: Data entry, 10 key, Word, Excel, book keeping knowledge helpful. \$13/hour. Taking resumes now, experience preferred.

You will learn valuable information about facing your new normal in life and renewing your hope for the future. Grief-related books/ materials are available for participants to borrow.

## A.A. Step By Step

Step Ten is Steps Four through Nine applied daily. I have heard others refer to Steps Ten through Twelve as 'maintenance steps'. I call them growth steps. No matter how old I get, these last three steps let me continue to challenge myself. Sometimes the healthiest thing I can do for myself is to admit I'm not perfect.

One of the most quoted lines in the AA Big Book appears on the discussion on Step Ten: "We are not cured of alcoholism. What we really have is a daily reprieve contingent on the maintenance of our spiritual condition". It is no easy task to change the behavior and thinking of a lifetime, even when I want to change. The Tenth Step allows me to be aware of sliding back into faulty thinking. I don't have to beat myself up over it. I just need to do what I can to make it right.

The Tenth Step askes us to 'promptly' admit we are wrong. A prompt admission is more effective than a delayed one in helping us acknowledge our negative behavior and to change it. A prompt admission is also more effective in defusing the anger that our inappropriate behavior has caused others. An essential part of understanding the amend process is to recognize that complete amend includes NOT repeating the same behavior.

Step Ten is a combination of taking an inventory regularly and promptly admitting when we are wrong. Some of us are tempted to ignore the inventory part and go right to the admitting we were wrong part. We are not working the Tenth Step unless we are doing both and probably will continue to make the same mistakes unless we work the step the way it was designed. We must work Step Ten daily till it becomes a habit.


Our personal inventory at the end of the day is a form of balance sheet. That means we review not only what we did wrong during the day but what we did right. When we take inventory we will want to look for many things. We can search out feelings that need our attention. We can look for low selfesteem creeping back in, but the critical part of our inventory is what we are doing right and on all the good around us.

The AA Twelve and Twelve suggests, when in doubt (about what to do) we can always pause, saying "Not my will, but Thine be done".

Take time for prayer and meditation. We do this Step to stay on track, not to punish ourselves or be under constant criticism. The Tenth Step is a daily application of the Golden Rule: Treat others as you would like to be treated.
