

From the desk of Pastor Sue:

I invite you to read Romans chapter 8 and then return to my report. The book of Romans is more than a theological explanation of God's redeeming grace—it is a letter of comfort and confidence addressed to you!

Romans 8: 26-27

"²⁶Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. ²⁷And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God."



Jesus prayed often; he taught his disciples to pray, and "The Lord's Prayer" continues to be a favorite one for many of us in our devotion time. It is found in Matthew 6: 9-13 and in Luke 11: 1-13. The Bible offers many ways to pray; you can read through the Psalms and give praise, lament, a cry for help, sing a love song, and remember God's glory. We have a lot of devotional books in our library for you to borrow. Sometimes, when we don't know what to say, we are able to just open our hearts to the Holy Spirit who intercedes our deepest desires for us.

Matthew 5: 43-45

"43" You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' 44 But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, 45 so that you may be children of your Father in heaven; for he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous."

Friends in Christ, there is a lot of vitriolic rhetoric floating around in our country, our government, our work-places and our homes, that goes against everything that we, as followers of Christ, should not engage in, but abhor. We are entitled to disagree with one another, but we are commanded to pray for each other, love each other, and hold each other in community, not divisive hatred. Calling people who disagree with us such names as "evil", "ignorant", or "disgusting," does not look good on us and it does not show the people around us that we are Christ's disciples. We are neither Gentile or Jew, slaves or free, but rather are all children of the same heavenly Father. Pray for your enemies and show them Christ's love.

Matthew 7: 7-11

⁷"Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. ⁸For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. ⁹Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for bread, will give a stone? ¹⁰Or if the child asks for a fish, will give a snake? ¹¹If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good things to those who ask him!

Matthew 7: 7-11

⁷"Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. ⁸For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. ⁹Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for bread, will give a stone? ¹⁰Or if the child asks for a fish, will give a snake? ¹¹If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good things to those who ask him!

We may wonder why some of our requests are not given to us as Jesus promised even though we have prayed our little hearts out. There are many answers to that question with the greatest one being that we are not God, and we cannot purport to understand the ways of God. Sometimes the answer may be "not yet." Sometimes God knows that we do not need what we are asking for. That is difficult for us to grasp. People who preach a prosperity gospel believe that they can pray for anything like financial wealth, a parking space, the Vikings to win! They do not preach that God knows our needs and will take care of us. You may wonder why God hasn't taken care of the poor or the homeless near us. We are the hands and feet of God on earth and are commanded to care for them.

Romans 8: 18

"18 I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us."

Nothing that we suffer through in our time will compare to the suffering of Jesus on our behalf. We have seen financial crisis, hurricanes, devastating wildfires, war on Ukraine, poverty, hunger, homelessness, and other travesties. Our time on earth is short and our suffering not worth comparing with the glory we will find at the end times.

Romans 8: 28

"²⁸We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose."

Sometimes we wonder what good can come out of our tragedies and our sufferings. But, it is true that all things work together for good through God's redeeming grace. Many of you have survived terrible things, yet your faith is unwavering. We may not understand how good can come out of a tragedy, but we must be open to seeing and believing that through God, all things are possible. We may not even see the good in this life, but rather, in eternal life.

Romans 8: 31-32

"31What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? 32He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else?"

Isn't it comforting to know that God is for us? He gave up His very own Son to save us. We can face any difficulty knowing that God is with us. We are enough! God loves all of God's children; God will not withhold the gift of salvation.

Romans 8: 35, 37 - 39

"³⁵Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?"

"³⁷No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Stay connected to the power! Keep your source with you and you will find strength and energy to complete your tasks. If you feel down and out, remember these words: "Nothing will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." We are called to live like we believe this! Love one another; pray for your enemies; make the words of your mouth and the meditations in your heart pleasing to God who loves you beyond measure.

From the desk of Shawna Berg:



Recently, I went to a funeral, of young woman that was in my first youth group, as a young youth director right out of college. It was a double funeral, a funeral remembering the lives of both she and her husband, who had both tragically died way too soon, leaving behind two young children. As I sat in the sanctuary, where I had worshiped with her, prayed with her and laughed with her the memories of her as a teenager washed over me. I listened to a former colleague of mine, who was currently her Pastor, speak eloquently of her life, and her faith.

As I was thinking of her, and of the raw emotions everyone was feeling, I kept thinking of the verse from John 11:35 "Jesus Wept". It was this verse that continued to bring me comfort, as I thought of the enormity of the emotions that everyone was feeling, The sadness, the anger, the confusion... sometimes we wonder – where is God?

I believe that when all of these terrible things are going on in the world, Jesus weeps, just as we do. It has become a mantra that I repeat over and over again every time I see something happening in my community or world that gives me pause.

Author Brene Brown recently said in an interview that faith was more like a midwife than an epidural. She said that she sought out faith and the church when going through personal crisis and pain hoping that the church would provide her relief from the pain, and found instead that they sat with her in it, helping her through it.

I love this analogy. Jesus is love incarnate. God in the flesh. God sent us Jesus to show us how much he loved us.

Loving God isn't always easy. (I'm sure God could say, "Right back at ya.") It means we are entering into a relationship that can bring us more happiness than we ever might imagine, but it also means that occasionally we might get angry or we just might not understand. It means we might be called to do things we don't want to do. It means we may be asked to love people we don't want to love. Sometimes things happen that we don't understand, and all we can do is be comforted in the knowledge that "Jesus wept" also. That God's heart also breaks when his children are hurting and that if we trust, we can be helped through the pain. That is Good News, and sometimes that is all of the promise that we can cling to, and sometimes that is enough.

Approval of May Meeting Minutes-this was done via email

Additions to September Agenda

Open Council seat- David Rock has resigned from his council seat immediately. Ronda and Bruce will be the signers for any green slips for Congregational Life and monitor budget. Pastor Sue will reach out to members/ groups to ask for help with the directory that is scheduled in October.

Custodial position- Kathy Schlieif has given her notice as of October 26. We will need to post the position.

Staff/Team Reports-Thank you to all who submitted team reports. Ronda reviewed with several teams some clarity from team reports. We will not have Pastor Sue or Shawna with us for the annual meeting in February.

Worship and Music- We will be trying something different on Wednesdays with worship. We will have dinner at 5:30 PM with worship beginning at 6 PM in the fellowship hall. Families will stay at their tables and will do communion in their seats. We will sing songs geared toward our young. Pastor Sue will connect with our musical team for logistics.

Youth-A recommendation was made to have a noisy offering for the Townswick family who lost their home to a fire. The recommendation was approved. Pastor Sue will share at this Sunday's worship and will do the offering the next Sunday.

ONGOING (Reoccurring items)

Highs/Lows- Several team members shared their highs.

Cadence of Council Meetings- Team shared feedback regarding summer meetings. We will review this process again in the spring for next summer.

Budget additions- Please share any additional budget items to help provide a 2023 calendar plan for monthly cash flow.

Celebrations- Please continue to share celebrations and take pictures of your team. We can share them with the congregation at the annual meeting.

HOUSEKEEPING (PROCEDURAL ITEMS)

Communications- Ronda checked with team members regarding best communication routes. If it is an "urgent" need from council members, texting will be utilized to check your email. For other communications, we will continue to use email. Please acknowledge that you received communication to the person sending the email and not the whole team to avoid a long email tail. It has happened that some mail may go to junk mail accounts for some. Feedback is the key to communication and we value all responses. We will also be sending the approved minutes to Joanna to share in the monthly newsletter.

OLD BUSINESS

Meal Packing Event- Our meal packing event will occur October 16th, 11 AM-1 PM. We have raised the expected funding of \$5,000 for the event. We are now in the need of volunteers from congregation members, families or groups that can help. We currently have approximately 35 people signed up with the need of a 100 volunteers total. Life Rice will set up and take down for the event. We will set up in the narthex after worship gathering for coffee. We have another group that will use our site for packing from 1 PM-3 PM Ronda will be the ambassador for this event.

Faithful Friends- This is a group of members who have been trained to visit members when sick, grieving, or needing companionship. This is a complement to pastoral care and not a replacement. Shawna, Marcy S. and Pat W-M are the leads with 4 others on the team.

Master Calendar- We will review this next month.

May 2022 Finance Report- Bruce shared finance reports. The negative balance of -\$2,765 in the General Fund this month is about the same as it was last month. Historically, we have seen an increase with the fall giving's. We have completed our high budgeted items that were needed for this year. The finance team has completed approximately 27 out of the 35 task of the list for 2022. Lots of improvement with processes such as check signers, Founders fund, green slips, and credit card limit usage. He reviewed the three step process for the 2023 budget proposal. We will see the 1st step next month with our current financials and proposed budgets for teams to begin planning.
