

"We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed . . ." as seen in a church nursery, from I Corinthians 15:51

Psychologists tell us that change, whether positive or negative, causes stress. Some people (like me) naturally like change more than others, while some have more difficulty dealing with change. Sociologists point out five common responses to change:

- 5% of people *seek change*, thrive on change, and create change. They are way out in front, setting the direction for the future.
- 20% of people are *early backers* of change. They easily understand the value change brings and embrace change with enthusiasm.
- 50% of people are *cautious adapters*. They need some time to adjust and get used to new ways.
- 20% of people are *late adapters*. They drive through life with parking brakes on—expending lots of energy to move forward and creating smoke and odor along the way.
- 5% of people *fight every change* they can as they walk through life.

Change can challenge our faith, character, and commitment. How do you feel about change? Does it fill you with excitement or dread? Does change symbolize conflict or new beginnings?

I know you've seen all the school supplies at Target and smelled that lovely crayon smell. While parents anxiously await the start of school, we are preparing too! We have some exciting changes coming at Long Lake Lutheran this year, especially in our Children, Youth, and Family ministry programs. I hope you will join us as we celebrate new growth, new beginnings, and new expressions of what it means to be the church. We are being intentional about using the Cornerstone well this year and are getting it ready for new classes and new ways to be together.

- Rally Sunday, September 10! We will not have class on this Sunday, but we will bless backpacks during worship, and invite all 3 year old through 9th grade students and parents to visit the Cornerstone for special activities and information and to update your contact information. Classes will begin Sept. 17.
- **Registration** is open online for both Sunday School and confirmation. Our data base is quite out of date, so please complete these forms as soon as possible so that we know the best way to communicate with you and have all the safety information that we need.

New worship schedule:

Traditional worship 8:30am

Contemporary worship 10:30am. This service will include the Lutheran liturgical style while adding updated music and a more relaxed style.

- Speaking of contemporary worship (and this thought might really make the more change-adverse among us squirm) ... but we could really use a small **drum set** or good hand drums. Do you have one to donate? We have a youth drummer (yay!), but it's a ton of work for them to bring their set each week.
- **Sunday School and Adult Education** will happen between worship services. Children will be dismissed to the Cornerstone following communion, and *Sunday School will run from 9:15-10:15am*.
- Our classes are **growing**! This year we will have one class for children ages 3 (and potty trained) to kindergarten and a second class for grades 1-5. Rachel Maguire will teach the younger group and Monica Petersen will teach the older. Thank you to both for their willingness and dedication! We are also building a substitute list, so if you would like to serve in this way please let Rachel, Monica, or me know. All adults working with kids will need a background check.

There will be **no Wednesday night Church School** this year.

Confirmation students in grades 6-8 will meet from 6:00-7:30 each Wednesday. We will start our time together with **worship** in the Cornerstone—all are welcome to join us!




